Yuma Navy League Council National Awards Winner 2020



(Fm Pg 1): Each year a select committee of our national leadership reviews the performance of all Navy League activity around the globe. For a small council such as ours to be recognized alongside major metropolitan councils is directly attributable to YOU, our membership. That we consistently rank each year among top councils nationally is remarkable (and frankly quite humbling). For 2020, the Yuma Council was recognized for:

Performance - Accomplishing all League mission requirements (below).

Communications - best use of social media (print/digital/video).

AS A COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATION, WHAT DO WE DO?

First and foremost is support of our active duty Marines, Sailors, and their families assigned to MCAS Yuma. By formally adopting the Air Station (1965) and its Navy medical/dental tenant commands (2015-16), we keep abreast of active duty current needs and put our time and finances where they are most helpful.

Second, to advocate and educate our elected leaders and general public, we participate in key networks such as the County Military Affairs Committee and Yuma 50. We founded Yuma's Military Appreciation Day (now a city heritage event), created the sea services component of our community's Veterans Day Parade, and were VIP representatives at the Christening of the USNS YUMA aboard Austal USA's east coast shipyard. We activity partner with other local organizations to "get 'er done" when necessary. Most recently was an initiative in providing bus transport funding for our active duty. We watched it quickly morph into a community transport fund coordinated by the Yuma County Chamber of Commerce. Teamwork!

Our third mission is equally important and has grown exponentially over the last decade; supporting Yuma's youth. Our small group of citizens are proud to provide several college scholarships annually and financially support Yuma's MC JROTC, Naval Sea Cadet, Navy League Cadet, and Young Marine programs.

Very few local organizations focus exclusively on supporting local sea service folks.

It is with great pride that we can announce, *cadet Chief*Petty Officer Reilly Cochrane has been selected to attend the USCG's Academy Introduction Program (AIM).

According to the USCG, **AIM** is the nation's most realistic service academy summer program as it challenges and inspires rising high school seniors interested in serving their country and exploring technical degree programs. During six action packed days, young men and women



immerse themselves in Coast Guard tradition and Academy life with current academy cadet leaders. AIM provides HS seniors the explore the USCG experience and decide if they are up to the challenge of applying for academy selection.

Is a national service academy (like Annapolis, West Point or USCG Academy) worth it? YES. You get an education valued at over \$400,000 for free as well as a guaranteed job paying around \$65,000 (salary plus housing and living expenses). The Issue - COVID19

The worldwide impact of COVID-19 is having a significant and extremely negative effect on the operation of militarily useful U.S.-flag commercial vessels enrolled in the Maritime Security Program (MSP) and their U.S. citizen crews. They need assistance to remain in a state of operational readiness available to provide the commercial sealift readiness capability as needed by the Department of Defense.

The Issue - JONES ACT SUPPORT

June 5 is the 100th anniversary of the Jones Act - the law that requires that vessels moving cargo between U.S. ports be American built, American owned and American crewed - is fundamental to our domestic maritime industry. You may know that there was significant turnover in Congress in the last election and many new members need to learn about the Jones Act, its importance to America and it relevance to their constituents. This becomes even more critical when one considers that there are well-funded groups working hard today, advocating for repeal of the Jones Act.

The Issue - USCG FUNDING

The Coast Guard needs more funding to support ever-growing maritime demands in an era of increased transnational criminal organization (TCO) activity, arctic activity, and Great Power Competition. With more than five consecutive clean audits, the Coast Guard is without a doubt the best bang for taxpayer dollars in the federal government.


The Issue - USN / USMC FUNDING

The Navy-Marine Corps team needs topline relief to support ever-growing maritime demands in an era of Great Power Competition, particularly as they have been tasked with an ever increased presence in the Pacific. As in the past when the Pentagon topline was flat, tough decisions are needed to support the current National Defense Strategy (NDS) developed in 2018. The percent of the Defense Department budget has always fluctuated and rarely been evenly divided among the three services.

The Issue - Our US FLAGGED MERCHANT MARINE TOO SMALL

The state of the U.S.-flag fleet is at a tipping point. The American oceangoing fleet has dropped to only 82 U.S.-flag ships in foreign trade. The Maritime Administration has testified that with a fleet this size we no longer can crew all US.-flag commercial and government reserve sealift vessels for a sustained period of more than six months if we face a national emergency or war.
