Taking the best leadership, character and skills training from our national sea services - the US Marine Corps, Navy and Coast Guard - the Yuma Sea Eagle Squadron held their first training and thus began their journey from basic recruit to Naval Sea Cadet.

Based at MCAS Yuma, the Sea Eagles are an aviation squadron, and as such, focus much of their advanced cadet training towards STEM-based technical skills - such as avionics, aviation engine design, robotics, communications, and cyber security. Once completed with their basic military requirements (and recruit boot camp), cadets will also be introduced to basic skills training involving seamanship, sailing, .22 cal weapons safety/qualification, land navigation, desert survival, and much, much more!




